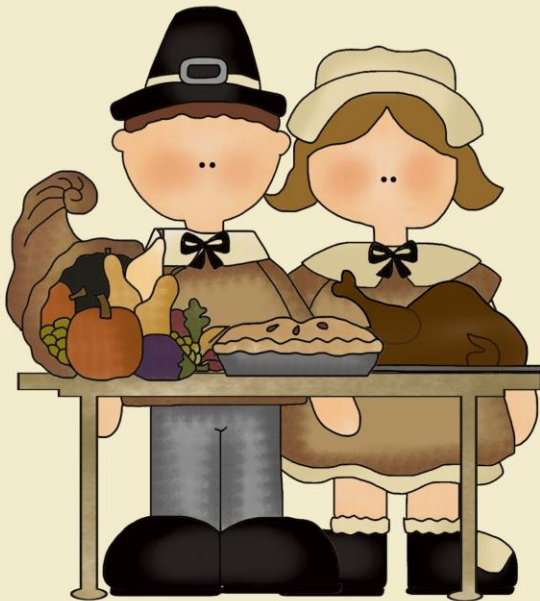

RECIPE CORNER

Every Norwegian home "must" serve 7 different kinds of cookies for a proper Christmas celebration. Here's a popular recipe for a Big Soft Ginger Cookie.

2 1/4 cups all-purpose flour
2 teaspoons ground ginger
1 teaspoon baking soda
3/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon ground cloves
1/4 teaspoon sea salt
3/4 cup butter, softened
1 cup sugar
1 egg
1 tablespoon water
1/4 cup molasses
2 tablespoons sugar

1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F. Sift together the flour, ginger, baking soda, cinnamon, cloves and salt. Set aside.
2. In a large bowl, cream together the butter and 1 cup of sugar until light and fluffy. Beat in the egg, then stir in the water and molasses. Shape dough into walnut-sized balls, and roll them in the remaining 2 Tblsps of sugar. Place the balls 2 inches apart onto an ungreased baking sheet and flatten slightly.
3. Bake for 8-10 minutes in the preheated oven. Allow cookies to cool on baking sheet for 5 minutes before removing to a wire rack to cool completely. Store in an airtight container.

Norwegian author's book makes movie debut

"The Snowman" is the first movie made from Jo Nesbo's popular series of novels about Oslo's premier--and probably most screwed up--police inspector.

Actor Michael Fassbender will play the part of Harry Hole (pronounced 'who-luh' according to the author, but Hole by everyone else)

Nesbo's books are wildly popular in Scandinavia, as might be expected, but also in Europe and even in America. Snowman is the seventh novel in the series. The thriller is part of what is being called Norwegian Noir, a film genre eerily dark and reminiscent of depression-era films. Hole and his partner, played by Swedish/English Rebecca Ferguson are chasing what appears to be normally orderly Norway's first serial killer. It's probably not a film to take youngsters to see, but adults will likely enjoy it.
